Mental Health Corner

There comes a time for all of us when we need help. We were made to exist within communities where we can both give support to and receive support from those around us.

This month, each grade spent time exploring resources available from Kid's Help Phone. I encouraged students that the resources and tools we explore during our time together, and the hope and strength we find in our faith, are not just for ourselves. **These things are meant to be shared**



to encourage others too! Which is why each student has the Kid's Help Phone number added as a contact in their phone - for now or for later, for themselves or someone they connect with who could benefit from additional mental health support.

In their own words, here's some of what's available at kidshelpphone.ca.

Mental Health Tips and Info

With Kids Help Phone's web resources, young people can get information about how their thoughts, feelings and behaviours are connected and what they can do to care for their well-being.

Crisis Support

If young people need help right now, they can text a trained, volunteer crisis responder at Kids Help Phone about anything they're going through. No issue is too big or too small.

Professional Counselling

Young people can work with a **professional counsellor** at Kids Help Phone over the phone or through online chat to better understand what they're going through.

There's a section on their site for "Resources for Caring Adults" (under the "Programs and Resources" tab). I'd encourage you to do some exploring of your own - for now or for later, for you and your family, or for someone you come in contact with who could benefit from additional mental health support.

Let's invest in growing as a community to better be able to provide and receive support from each other!

Home and School Association




